Information:

All Saints' Day is the Catholic holiday that commemorates all of the Saints. This day is typically a holy day of obligation. However, this year it is not. Some Holy Days of Obligation are abrogated when they fall on a Saturday or Monday. All Saints' Day is one such day. This holiday is celebrated on November 1st each year right after Halloween. Many cultures celebrate All Saints' Day in conjunction with Halloween and All Souls' Day, which is on November 2nd each year and commemorates all people who have died. All Saints' Day is especially important because it not only celebrates all the Saints that we know about (like Saint Bernard of Clairvaux), but Saints that only God knows about. The Saints that might not have been canonized, but in God's eyes are Saints. All Saints' Day Mass times for St. Bernard will be at 8:00 am. We hope to see you there!
